Torsanlorenzo Prize 2009

March 6 2009 is the **deadline** for submitting entries to this edition of the Torsanlorenzo prize. This annual prize was designed to recognise exceptional landscape design projects and promote the qualities of urban green spaces and environmental restoration. It is organised for the fifth time with the support of the UIA and other professional planning organisations, such as the International Federation of Landscape Architects (IFLA). The prize is open to architects and professionals of landscape architecture registered in a professional body in their countries. Projects that have already won other prizes are not eligible for the 2009. prize. There is no registration fee. Registration will be made at the time of submitting the documents. 1st Mediterranean Conference on Earth Architecture

Cagliari, Italy. March 13-16 2009. The **First Mediterranean Conference on Earth Architecture** results from a preliminary study completed by ICCROM, CRATerre and GCI for the purpose of sustaining the conservation and the "mise en valeur" of the Mediterranean earthen architectural heritage. The conference marks the beginning of a Mediterranean cooperation on the topics related to earthen architecture. The event represents a unique opportunity for exchange and discussion of the achievements acquired on the specific theme as a direct result of the constant and significant work carried out systematically by the countries facing the Mediterranean Basin. Mediterra 2009 aims principally to assess the state of research related to earth architecture in the Mediterranean region, to study recent developments in the fields of heritage conservation and architectural design as they relate to earthen architecture, and to create more active networks among professionals in the region whose work relates to earthen architecture themes: Earth-building cultures and traditional architecture; archaeology, history, and anthropology; conservation of cultural heritage; research about architecture, town planning and cultural landscape and academic teaching and professional training. 15th International Symposium on Society and Resource Management (ISSRM)

The **deadline** for scientific paper and poster abstracts has been **extended to March 16 2009**. The theme of this year's symposium is: **Meet Old and New Worlds in Research, Planning and Management** and the emphasis will be on discussing methodological traditions versus pragmatic solutions, exploring cultural and political influences on planning and decision making processes, and addressing the trans-disciplinary and trans-boundary character of research and management. Le congrès annuel 2009 de l'Association d'architectes paysagistes (AAPQ) s'inscrit dans la mouvance du développement durable et portera un regard sur l'amélioration du cadre de vie face au vieillissement. Dans cette perspective, les conférences et la formation, qui auront lieu à **Montréal, Canada du 20 au 21 mars 2009** exploreront trois thématiques particulières: **soigner, habiter et se déplacer**. Landscape Architecture Competition

The City Council of Madrid and the Owners' Management Board of Parque de Valdebebas, a new development in **Madrid**, would like to announce the launching of an International Ideas Competition for the design of an urban park. The Competition arises from the need to create a quality green space for the use and enjoyment of the future residents of the urban development, but also with the ambition of becoming a recreation and nature reference for the city as a whole. The aim of the competition is to secure the services of a multidisciplinary team that will plan and design a **new urban park** of approximately 80 hectares in Parque de Valdebebas. The design should resolve the transition between the urban area currently being developed and the adjacent forest park. Of utmost importance will be the proposed uses and their suitability for the scale and location of the park. To this end the winning design will need to make the most of the planning, landscape, environmental and social opportunities offered by the site. The competition is a two-stage process with an initial **open call for proposals**, at the level of conceptual design, from which six finalists will be chosen to develop design proposals in the second stage. First phase **deadline** for proposals: **April 16 2009**. The six finalists resulting from the first phase will receive an honorarium of **10,000 €** to help cover costs. 2nd International Symposium on Dark-sky Parks

Call for Papers. "The Role of Protected Areas in Reducing Light Pollution: Strengthening the Mission in Conserving Nature". The aim of the Symposium on Dark-sky Parks to be held in **Lastovo, Croatia on September 14-19 2009** is to establish an

effective long-term framework for reducing light pollution internationally. The emphasis of the symposium is on collaborative and cooperative approaches to the multiple disciplines involved in the response to the problem of light pollution. The conference will discuss traditional and recent practical light pollution issues, focusing on strategies, experiences and techniques with regards to reducing it. The program committee welcomes original contributions on the following example topics: The role of protected areas in preservation of biodiversity, conservation and education about nature at night; Tourism opportunities in the natural night sky; Biological effects of artificial light, scotobiology– biology of darkness; Darkness and human health; Spiritual and artistic dimensions of nocturnal landscapes; Possibilities for a functioning institutional framework; Legal and institutional solutions to implementation of the Starlight; Declaration and reduction of light pollution; Technical solutions for light pollution; advanced techniques in ecological outdoor lighting; New lighting technologies – benefits and drawbacks (LED, etc.); Relevant experience in the preservation of the natural dark-sky; Monitoring of light pollution; Classification of protected areas in relation to the quality of the dark-sky. Urban Ecology and Ecological Design: Perspectives on Integration and Future Directions

A workshop entitled "Urban Ecology and Ecological Design: Perspectives on Integration and Future Directions" will be held on **5th November 2009** in conjunction with the 40th Anniversary celebrations of the Landscape Architecture Programme at Lincoln University, New Zealand from 6-8th November. The workshop is the annual Flock Hill workshop for 2009 and is sponsored by the Isaac Centre for Nature Conservation (ICNC). On the evening of 5th November immediately after the workshop, Dr Diane Menzies, the President of the International Federation of Landscape Architects (IFLA) will deliver the annual ICNC State of the Environment address. The topic of this presentation will also focus on urban ecology and design. The main goal of the proposed workshop is to emphasise urban ecology and design research as one of the main directions of the Isaac Centre for Nature Conservation and Landscape Architecture School in the Faculty of Environment, Society and Design. The objectives of this workshop are to: Identify new directions for teaching and research in urban ecology and ecological design; Exchange leading concepts from specialists in the field; Increase the research profile of urban ecology and design at Lincoln University; Increase the global visibility of Lincoln University as a potential institution for Masters and PhD research in urban ecology and ecological design. It will be a one day workshop with presentations and discussions including a short 2-3 hour field trip in Christchurch. Two outstanding international specialists will deliver keynote addresses (yet to be finalised). We envisage participation from academics, students, practitioners and representatives from local bodies. Participants are encouraged to stay on after the workshop (6-8th November) to celebrate the 40th anniversary of the Landscape Architecture School and the grand opening of the new purpose built Landscape Architecture building.
