NZILA 2009: The Big Picture Workshop

Queenstown Thursday 2-Saturday 4 April 2009. Large scale changes to our landscapes can challenge our values, our sense of beauty and even our regional identity. The 2009 NZILA workshop conference will explore these issues with site visits and workshop sessions relating to conflicting interests and pressures associated with managing large scale landscape change. The setting for this conference is the alpine resort town of Queenstown. The Queenstown Lakes District is known nationally for both the tourism that its spectacular landscapes attract and for a series of Environment Court decisions that made significant findings regarding landscape management. These have resulted in specific provisions to the District Plan that are relevant to New Zealand as a whole. The focus of the workshop and site visits is to examine some of the pressures and management responses which have developed in this area. The conference has four themes: landscapes of recreation, landscapes for rural living, landscapes of production, and landscapes of energy. Sizdah be-dar (lit. "getting rid of thirteen") is the Persian Festival of "Joy and Solidarity" celebrated on the 13th day of the new year and the month of Farvardin (corresponding to **April 1 or 2**, depending on leap or non-leap year), the last day of the Norooz (Iranian New Year) period. The custom is for families to pack a picnic and spend the day outdoors in a park or the countryside. A ritual performed at the end of the picnic day is to throw away the sprouts people grow at the beginning of Norooz to a river, symbolizing the cycle of life (source: <http://www.dusharm.com/content/view/12/2/>).
